Famine is a great threat to life. Famine in Canaan became the first acid test to Abram's faith. The natural instinct for survival betrayed his spirituality. He resorted to common sense, as he shunned the mountains and the place of the altar, to go down into Egypt. Egypt offered him riches and room to express his residual carnality. By divine intervention, he was extracted from Egypt and returned to Canaan.
